Georgian

(1750-1770 HOMES)

Found in the homes of well-to-do merchants and landowners, these moldings have bold shapes and proud projections; the crown molding typically includes dentil molding.

Federal

(1770-1800 HOMES)

Lighter and more delicate than Georgian, these moldings have cavetto shapes (concave quarter circle) and simple beads for a more refined look.

Greek Revival

(1820-1860 HOMES)

Plain and bold with little decoration, these moldings have flat faces in an effort to mimic stone.

These casing examples are from the Kuiken Bros. collection of historically accurate molding profiles. Crown, casing, base and chair rail molding is available in each style. Georgian and Federal casing is \$3.98 per foot, Greek Revival casing is \$3.01. Kuiken Bros. casings are 1½ to 2 inches thick, compared with 1⅛ to 1⅞ inches for most stock lumberyard casings.
